

New EZ Care open along Route 1

Seven years ago (in August 2011), EZ Care opened as a weekend-only clinic on Horizon Health's main campus. Today, the clinic offers convenient, non-emergency medical care seven days a week in a new building along Route 1 South in Paris.

The new EZ Care not only provides more space than its previous locations, but also includes X-ray services.

The building also houses a second service, the NAL Health Clinic, which is dedicated solely to NAL employees and their families.

EZ Care is a walk-in medical clinic similar to an immediate or quick care clinic found in retail stores. The clinic treats minor conditions such as ear, nose and throat infections, flu symptoms, pink eye, rashes, burns, and bug bites in patients three months and older. Some minor procedures can be performed.

EZ Care is staffed by board-certified physician assistants and nurse practitioners. Because EZ Care is a medical clinic and not

an emergency department, patients are treated on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of their reason for treatment or severity of condition. No appointments are taken.

Whether you go to EZ Care or the emergency room is initially your decision. Keep in mind that an emergency department treats the sickest patients first – not on a first-come, first-served basis – and longer wait times can sometimes be expected. Additionally, emergency department charges are higher than those at convenient care clinics. The provider on duty at EZ Care will ultimately determine whether your condition should be treated in the clinic or the emergency department.

After your visit to EZ Care, all follow-up care will be performed through your primary care provider, who will be notified of your EZ Care visit.

EZ Care is open Monday through Friday from 9 am to 7 pm, and Saturday and Sunday from 10 am to 6 pm. The clinic is open 362 days a year, closed only on Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

EZ Care or the ER?

EZ Care is an urgent care, non-emergency walk-in clinic that treats a variety of health conditions (see front page article). It should be used to treat minor illnesses and injuries when your regular provider is not available.

The emergency department treats illnesses and injuries as well, but should only be used for conditions that pose an immediate, serious threat to a person's health or life.

Refer to the charts on the right to learn the difference between EZ Care and the emergency department.
