37 years of service

Dr. Haskell Retires

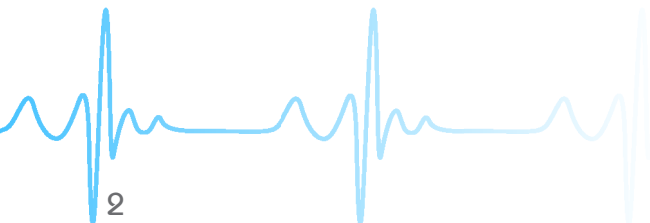


Dr. Duane Haskell, general surgeon, retired from PCH/FMC in June 2013 after 37 years of service.

He spent his professional medical career at PCH/FMC, performing everything from gallbladder and hernia surgeries to colonoscopies, and more. He joined PCH/FMC in 1975 and was one of three full-time surgeons at the time, along with Drs. Gordon Sprague and Jerry Ingalls.

Dr. Haskell was a pioneer at PCH/FMC, witnessing the introduction of endoscopy, the advancement of X-rays, and the development of CT scans as a new technology. He is credited as the first general surgeon to perform laparoscopic gallbladder surgery at the hospital. At one time, he was the only general surgeon in Edgar and Clark counties and worked 13 years as the sole on-call surgeon at the hospital.

Prior to his retirement, Dr. Haskell had been working on a semi-retired basis. He served as medical director for the local ambulance service and the hospital's Occupational Health and Pain Management clinics.





New Providers

The basis of healthcare is the provider/physician–patient relationship. This year at PCH/FMC, new relationships were fostered with the addition of several new providers.



Steven Macke, MD

A well-known physician from Clark County, Dr. Macke joined PCH/FMC in the spring, bringing 34 years of experience in family practice medicine. He previously worked in Mattoon, where he

had practiced since 2009. Dr. Macke also practiced in Marshall. He was medical director at Burnside's Nursing Home/Burnside's Community Health Center in Marshall for many years.



Angela Hamilton, FNP-C

Hamilton, a Paris native, joined the PCH/FMC Orthopedics Department in November as a family nurse practitioner, working under supervising physician John “Chip” Rowe, MD.

She previously practiced dermatology in Terre Haute, Ind. She continues to work in the PCH/FMC EZ Care clinic, which she has done since 2011.



Cardiology Services

In September, PCH/FMC welcomed cardiologist Morteza Farasat, MD, as a visiting specialty physician. He is affiliated with Carle Physician Group in Urbana with interests in non-invasive cardiology, nuclear cardiology, vascular ultrasound, and echocardiography.



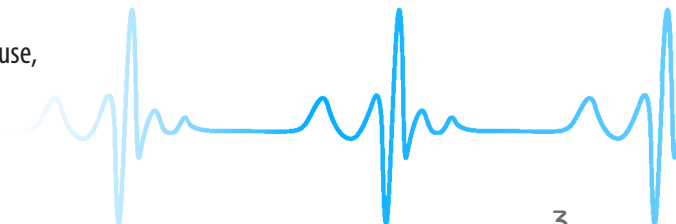
Gastroenterology Services

{employee recognition}

Employee recognition reached new heights in 2013. A new program was created to recognize the extraordinary achievements of non-nursing staff. Additionally, an ongoing awards program specific to nursing staff occurred more frequently throughout the year than in the past.



The High 5 PRIDE Award was created to recognize non-nursing staff for their outstanding patient care and/or teamwork. Winners are highlighted for being outstanding role models in providing exceptional service to patients, visitors, families, physicians, and caregivers.



The Daisy Award, a national recognition program, honors nurses who go above and beyond the call of duty to give their patients the best care possible. Formerly awarded annually, this year the award was presented several times throughout the year to more regularly recognize nurses for a job well done.

{ joint commission accreditation }



PCH/FMC continued its commitment to top quality care and patient safety standards, earning The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval as an accredited critical access hospital.

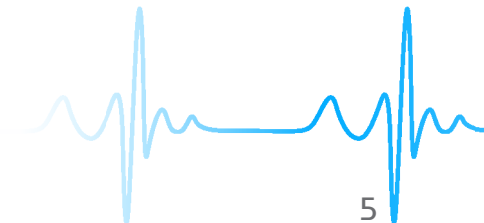
Receiving the three-year accreditation means that PCH/FMC complies with the highest national standards for safety and quality of care. Seeking Joint Commission accreditation is voluntary, and PCH/FMC has been an accredited hospital since it first applied for the status in 1998.

The Joint Commission, which independently evaluates and accredits more than 15,000 healthcare organizations and programs in the US, conducted an intensive and unannounced three-day survey and tour of the hospital in May. As part of its survey, the Joint Commission used a "tracer" methodology, which tracks a patient's experience from the time he or she is admitted to the hospital until the time of discharge.

The survey included a visit from a life safety specialist who inspected such things as the hospital building and grounds, signage, entrance and exit points, and emergency management plans. Surveyors also reviewed the hospital's overall environment of care, infection prevention and control methods, the medical staff and leadership, and national patient safety goals.

The Joint Commission praised the hospital for its work in the following areas:

- Surveyors commended the hospital for its multi-disciplinary approach to the care of hospitalized patients, which involves a team of nurses, physical therapists, and a dietician meeting weekly to discuss each patient's progress and individualized care plan.
- The Commission applauded the hospital for its electronic documentation system in the emergency department, noting its ease of use and accuracy in capturing information related to patient visits.
- A wall-mounted filing/organizing system within the special care and medical/surgical areas, which contains patient and staff educational materials, was deemed a best practice that should be shared with other healthcare facilities.
- The Kansas Family Medical Center was complimented for its home town delivery of healthcare services.
- Surveyors noted that nursing staff fully understood and complied with Joint Commission standards.



{ community health needs assessment }



In collaboration with the Illinois Critical Access Hospital Network, Paris Community Hospital conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in 2013 to identify important healthcare needs in Edgar County. An Implementation Strategy was then developed to address the most pressing needs identified in the CHNA for implementation in 2014 and 2015.

To address the health needs of the community, the CHNA interviewed 34 individuals who were part of three focus groups:

- **Community leaders**—representatives of churches, large employers, community organizations, business owners, and others.
- **Healthcare professionals and partners**—representatives of the Edgar County Health Department and Chester P. Sutton Senior Center, physicians, a pharmacist, and others.
- **Community officials**—comprised of a superintendent of schools, mayors, county board members, and others.

The focus groups identified the following health needs as top priorities in Edgar County:

Basic wellness services, education, and access for all residents

All age groups should have access to wellness education, nutrition education, and healthy foods. Instances of diabetes, asthma, obesity, arthritis, and high blood pressure are apparent in our community. Sedentary lifestyles and environmental issues also affect our residents' health.

Mental health services

More mental health programs are needed in the community and at PCH. This pertains to youth, young adults, the uninsured, and underinsured. There is also a need to address substance abuse and post-hospital placement for individuals needing mental health services.

Access to quality local healthcare

There is a need to increase access to medical specialists and to sustain access to general practitioners. The community must also plan ahead to ensure health services provided by PCH and other local healthcare providers are accessible to all residents in the future, including the uninsured and underinsured.

To address these needs, an implementation strategy has been developed and is being executed by the PCH Administrative Team. Examples of this plan include the following:

Example: To provide general wellness education for all age groups, expand reduced-cost baseline testing and information (explore using satellite clinics).

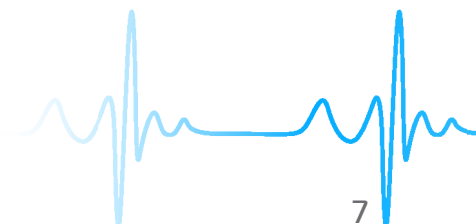
Example: To provide nutrition education for all age groups, continue the nutrition education program in schools, and continue to assist Senior Education Ministries with its “Dine with a Doc” program.

Example: To increase access to specialists, add two to four new specialty services, including a full-time general surgeon.

The CHNA, which was completed in August, serves as a guide for planning and implementing healthcare initiatives that will allow the hospital to best serve the emerging health needs of residents in its primary service area.



Federal law requires PCH and most other not-for-profit hospitals to conduct a CHNA every three years.



{community services and programs}



PCH/FMC continued to offer free health-related events and programs for Edgar County students and the community as a whole.

School Wellness Programs

PCH/FMC provided a series of wellness programs in Paris schools utilizing a \$5,000 grant from the Illinois Critical Access Hospital Network (ICAHN). Programs included CPR/first aid classes for high school students, teachers, and coaches; and diabetes screenings and blood typing for local high schoolers.

Another initiative was Henry the Hand, a national program used to teach young children the importance of hand washing. Additionally, PCH/FMC worked with Paris Cooperative High School and the University of Illinois Extension Office to implement a student vegetable garden. PCH/FMC has also donated break-away bases to the Paris Girls Softball Association and Paris Little League.



The Healthy Schools program was continued for fourth-grade students in five Edgar County schools. The program, now in its third year, allows PCH/FMC dietician Jan Coombe to visit the schools and provide nutrition lessons. The program started in 2011 with grant funds, and continued in 2012 and 2013 with all funding provided by PCH/FMC.

Nursing Honor Guard

PCH/FMC implemented a Nursing Honor Guard program to recognize and pay homage to area men and women who have committed their lives to nursing. The Honor Guard pays tribute to local registered nurses and licensed practical nurses upon their death. The tribute is modeled after a program established in Vincennes, Ind.

Community Events

PCH/FMC engaged in community events and partnered with local organizations throughout the year. It participated in numerous fairs and festivals during the summer months, and partnered with schools to provide hands-on tours. Additionally, PCH/FMC provided the community with discounted health screenings, free Vial of Life kits, lung screenings, and diabetes screenings.

PCH/FMC continued to participate in the Dine With a Doc program, providing meal sponsorships and speakers on a monthly basis. PCH/FMC also sponsored several events of its own, including its annual Caregivers Expo, Diabetes Update, Safe Sitter classes, grief programs, and various support groups.

Donations

As in previous years, PCH/FMC continued to provide an athletic trainer to Paris Cooperative High School at a cost of \$10,000, plus supplies. In its continuing effort to support the community, PCH/FMC also donated 119 refurbished computers to 48 organizations throughout Edgar County. The organizations included schools, churches, public libraries, and others located in Hume, Chrisman, Redmon, Kansas, and Paris.

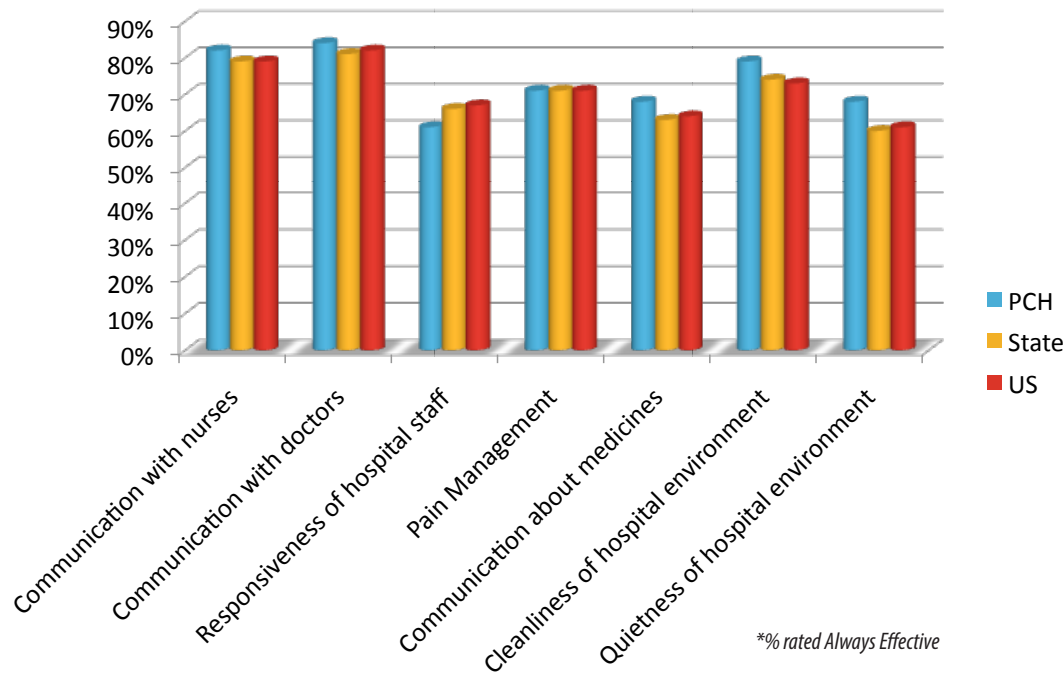

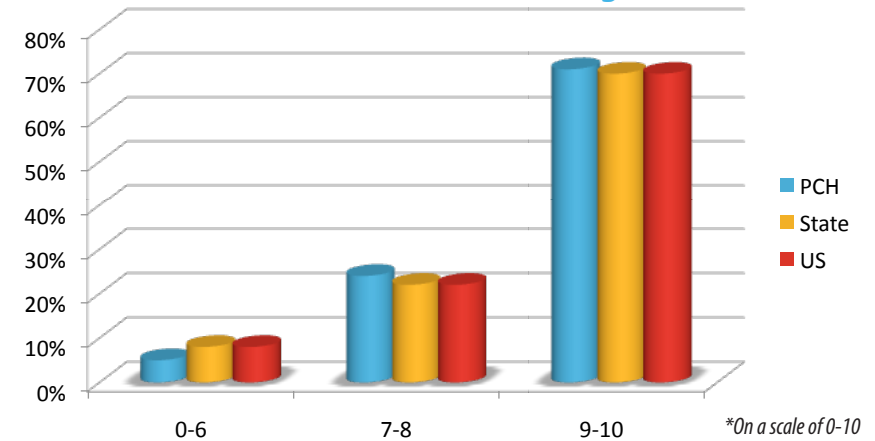
At PCH/FMC, the Infection Control/Quality Improvement Department is responsible for tracking and reporting on HCAHPS (Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems) results, as well as many other key measures. They report data to such organizations as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), American Hospital Association (AHA), The Joint Commission (see article on page 5), and many others. The Infection Control/Quality Improvement Department also leads PCH/FMC employees in working to improve results. The following are some of the quality initiatives from 2013:

- New prompts were added to the physician and nursing documentation systems to ensure all necessary information is being accurately recorded.
- HCAHPS Patient Satisfaction education was provided for the Quality Committee of the board of directors.
- Staff education on patient satisfaction was conducted; inpatient satisfaction scores improved.

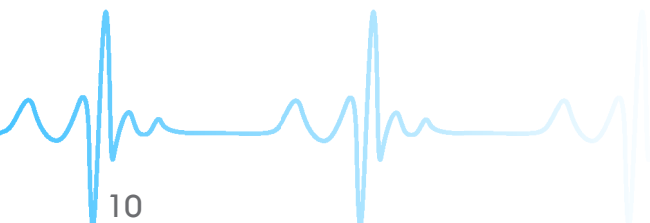
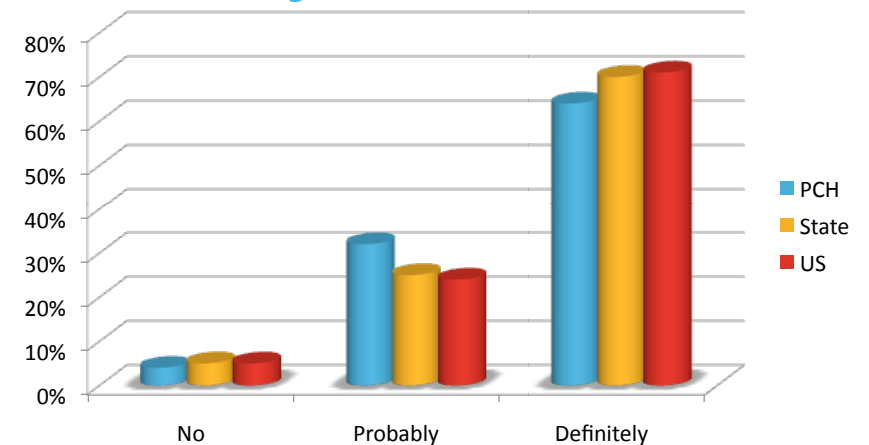
PCH inpatient HCAHPS report*

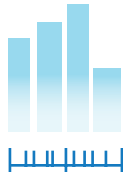

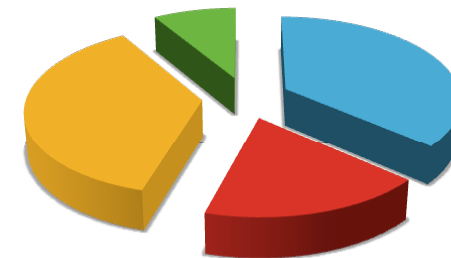

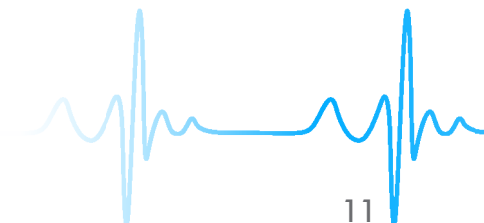

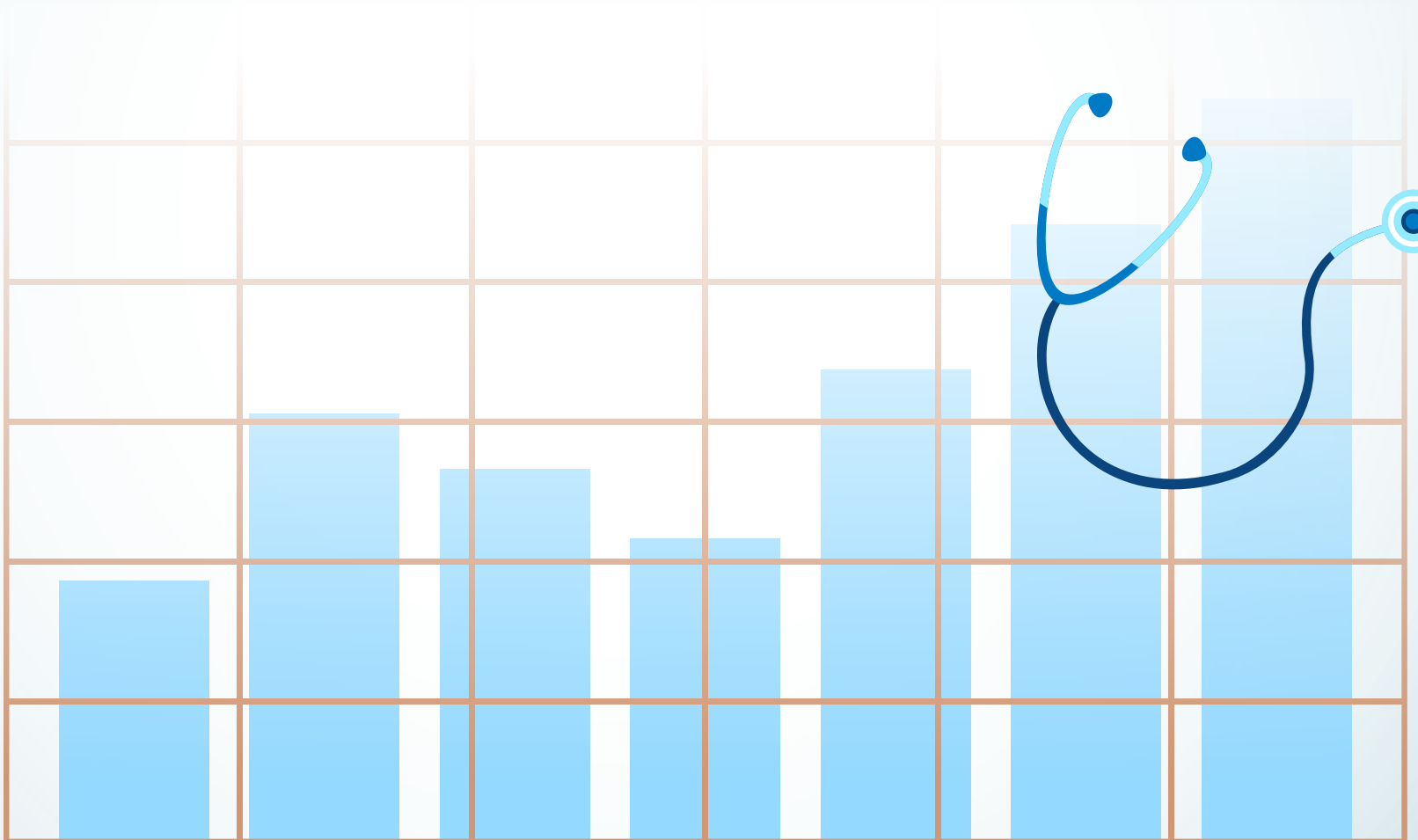


The momentum continues!
