# 2018 REBRAND

We're the same, just more.


# Paris Community Hospital/Family Medical Center's decision to rebrand to Horizon Health is best illustrated by the "green egg."

The visual representation was conceived by drawing a green, oblong shape around PCH/FMC's service area and physical locations. The green egg shows how the organization had grown to become more than its name – Paris Community Hospital/Family Medical Center – suggested. The egg was used as a tool to illustrate what needed to be named – not any specific entity within the egg, but rather the overarching egg as a whole.

With the launch of the rebrand in April, PCH/FMC's physical locations changed their names from Family Medical Centers to Clinics. The Horizon Health brand now includes Paris Community Hospital, Paris Clinic, Chrisman Clinic, Oakland Clinic, EZ Care, and Senior Care, as well as the many services offered within each of those locations/facilities.

#### **WHY REBRAND?**

The process to rebrand included several internal and external focus groups, hospital administration, the marketing department, and a consultant. The reason for rebranding was based on several factors:



- > To better convey physical growth. New building projects included construction of (1) a permanent EZ Care clinic/NAL Health Clinic in Paris, (2) an EZ Care clinic in Marshall, (3) the hospital's surgery area to expand the outpatient space, (4) a new rehabilitation services building (including a sleep lab) on the main hospital campus, and (5) the former Kreckman Building in Paris to serve as Horizon Health's Financial Operations Center (FOC).
- **> To better convey reach and impact.** PCH/FMC experienced significant growth in physician recruitment, service line expansion, and quality over the past several years. The organization employs a full-time endocrinologist and urogynecologist, specialists not traditionally available in rural areas and lacking in even larger, nearby communities.
- **> To create a sense of inclusion.** Focus groups determined that Paris Community Hospital/Family Medical Center mentioned only two specific facilities and did not accurately reflect services beyond those two locations. With its growth, the organization's reach goes beyond Paris and even Edgar County. Therefore, a need existed for all physical locations to identify as being part of the same organization.
- **To operate with a less cumbersome name.** The name Paris Community Hospital/Family Medical Center wasn't practical for everyday use.

#### **BRAND ROLLOUT**

The new Horizon Health brand was introduced to employees first. The employee-reveal celebration included a green eggs and ham breakfast, mobile happy hour, and polo shirts with the new logo provided for all staff.

Horizon Health debuted publicly April 16 with the name and logo appearing on facility signage, community sponsorship signs, correspondence, and more. The public was assured that the new brand did not mean the organization had been purchased.

#### **WHAT'S IN A NAME?**

During the rebrand process, 80 name options were considered. An abbreviated list was presented to employee focus groups and ultimately the board of directors for final approval. The Horizon Health name was chosen because it suggests a pioneering spirit. It envisions the good times to come, as well as the day-to-day aspect of "living on the horizon" in the open landscape of our home. Horizon Health is a reminder of the organization's commitment to the future.



For patients, the new brand meant:



Access to providers and technology not traditionally found in rural areas.



Same ownership, management, and employees that they have trusted for years.



Continued commitment to the organization's mission of providing patients with the best possible healthcare.



Expanded services and locations to meet their healthcare needs.





# **MORE SERVICES**







#### **AMBULANCE SERVICE**

When the Horizon Health brand was unveiled in April, so was the addition of a new ambulance service. Horizon Health Emergency Medical Services (HHEMS) was introduced as a service offering emergent and nonemergent transports 24 hours a day, every day of the year. The service received licensing for two advanced cardiac life support ambulances. Both rigs are staffed with a paramedic and EMT. Each ambulance has cardiac monitors, 12-lead EKGs, Wi-Fi data transmission, bariatricweighted Stryker® power cots, and all other supplies necessary to administer patient care.

Between April 17 and December 31, Horizon Health EMS made 520 runs. It logged 17,656 miles (with a patient on board). Its farthest run was a patient transfer to a mental health facility in Chicago. The service assisted in various capacities in Charleston, Mattoon, Marshall, Chrisman, Hume, Grandview, Kansas, Metcalf, Ridge Farm, and Paris. The service consisted of 25 EMS staff, which included paramedics, pre-hospital registered nurses, and EMT basics.

Due to its extensive growth and the need for more space at the main hospital campus, EZ Care was given a permanent home at 1 Phipps

Located across from the Paris industrial park, the new building also houses the NAL Health Clinic, a service of Horizon Health, which is dedicated solely to North American Lighting employees and their families (see NAL Health Clinic on the next page). The EZ Care building opened in June and includes a basement for future buildout and provider space.

EZ Care had been operating out of a temporary, portable building on the property since January 2017. The permanent EZ Care structure was built on land adjacent to the portable building.

The new EZ Care includes X-ray and lab services (testing performed at Paris Community Hospital). Additional staff was added, including Carrie Cunningham, family nurse practitioner and EZ Care clinic manager.









#### **NAL HEALTH CLINIC**

After more than a year of planning, North American Lighting (NAL) partnered with Horizon Health to establish a primary care clinic for its employees and family members who are covered by NAL's health insurance.

The NAL Health Clinic, located in the new EZ Care building at 1 Phipps Lane, offers all facets of primary care, including health maintenance, disease prevention, patient education, and treatment of acute and chronic conditions.

The goal of the partnership is to provide NAL and its employees with better healthcare at a reasonable cost. For NAL staff and families enrolled in the Standard or Economy Plans, clinic visits – as well as a formulary of stocked, generic prescriptions – are provided at no charge. Staggered hours were established to accommodate NAL employees and their various work schedules. Should an employee need care when the NAL Health Clinic is not open, the same coverage applies to their visits at EZ Care.

The clinic consists of Paige Wampler, family nurse practitioner and primary provider; Carrie Cunningham, family nurse practitioner and EZ Care clinic manager; and a team of support staff.

#### **TELEPSYCHIATRY**

To help meet a local need for advanced mental health services, a telepsychiatry service was created through a partnership of Horizon Health and the Human Resources Center of Edgar and Clark Counties (HRC).

Telepsychiatry uses videoconferencing technology, linking board-certified psychiatrists in the Chicago area with patients (age 5 and older) at Horizon Health. The service consists of three physicians and additional staff from Horizon Health and HRC.

#### **BIG & LOUD PROGRAM**

The Rehabilitation Services Department launched two new programs to help individuals with Parkinson's disease improve their speech and body movement. Both are led by programcertified therapists and supported by scientific research. Patients in the program come from as far away as Terre Haute and Effingham.

#### "LSVT BIG"

The guiding principle for this physical therapy program is "Think BIG!" as it reteaches patients how normal movement should feel. This involves refining smaller movements, such as self-care, to larger movements, such as getting up from a sofa or maintaining balance while walking.

#### "LSVT LOUD"

This speech therapy program is considered the "gold standard" of speech treatment. It helps patients speak with a voice and volume that is easy for others to hear and understand. Patients can experience better articulation, changes in swallowing, improved facial expressions while talking, and even speech-related brain changes.





# MORE COMMUNITY

Horizon Health participated in more community events and initiatives than ever before. Participation in local parades nearly doubled, from eight in 2017 to 14 in 2018, adding West Terre Haute and Ashmore to the list. With help from the employee-driven Community Ambassador Group, Horizon Health sponsored Pack the Place events at local sporting events and a movie night in Marshall. Employees participated in the Race for the Cure and established a new presence in local Christmas parades.

#### **WEAR RED EVENT**

The fifth annual event, held during American Heart Month in February, featured Dr. Tony Nasser, cardiologist with Providence Medical Group in Terre Haute. Dr. Nasser discussed the importance of understanding blood pressure numbers, the benefits of wine, and smoking cessation.

#### **SPORTS PHYSICALS**

During the summer, Horizon Health provided discounted sports physicals at its Chrisman and Oakland clinics. Half the cost of each \$20 physical was donated back to the booster club of each participating student's choice. Donations totaled approximately \$350 per school.

#### ATHLETIC TRAINERS

Horizon Health continued its commitment of providing athletic trainers for Paris, Chrisman, and Tri-County sports. One of the trainers was provided through a partnership with Eastern Illinois University. Two of the trainers are employees of Horizon Health's Rehabilitation Services Department.

#### **HOPE HOUSE**

Forty-three Horizon Health employees donated \$400 to Hope House, a local shelter for teens. The employees raised the money by collectively losing 400 pounds during an employee wellness initiative called, "The Biggest Winner." Each participant got one vote for the charity of their choice. Other monies from the wellness initiative were used to reward the top three employees who lost the greatest percentage of body weight.

#### **CORPORATE CUP**

Horizon Health's first annual Corporate Cup event raised \$677 for Hope House. Corporate Cup was an opportunity to promote community-wide interest and involvement in fitness, health activities, and corporate team building. Four local businesses competed in various events, including cornhole, tug-of-war, dodgeball, and an obstacle course.

#### TOY DRIVE

Horizon Health worked with Christmas for Kids to collect toys for Edgar County children in need. Drop-off locations were established at Horizon Health clinics and at annual Christmas events in Paris and Chrisman. Toys dropped off in Marshall were donated to Marshall schools.







# Scholarships

Healthcare scholarships worth \$7,000 were awarded to local students to further their education in the healthcare field. These included the annual Doc Acklin scholarships, nursing scholarships, PCH Volunteers' scholarships, and the first-ever Dr. Leland Phipps Memorial Scholarship, which was awarded to a Horizon Health employee.







## **MORE RECOGNITION**

#### **ACUTE STROKE-READY HOSPITAL**

Paris Community Hospital retained its designation as an Acute Stroke-Ready Hospital in Illinois, which it initially received in 2015. To maintain the designation, the hospital was required to submit data to the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) to indicate its ability to treat strokes according to national standards of care for stroke patients.

IDPH defines an Acute Stroke-Ready Hospital as being one capable of diagnosing, treating, and transporting acute stroke patients to a higher level of care as warranted. The re-designation also means that ambulances transporting potential stroke patients cannot bypass PCH.

#### DIABETES EXCELLENCE

Horizon Health's Diabetes Education Program continued to prove why it has received official recognition from the American Diabetes Association since 1994. In 2018, patients in the program experienced a relative reduction of 21 percent on average in their A1c results (absolute decrease from 8.67-6.86). Also in 2018, Leighsa Cornwell, RN, BS, CDE, and Debbie Griffin, APRN, FNP, CDE, successfully renewed their Certified Diabetes Educator (CDE) status.

#### **CRNA TRAINING SITE**

Horizon Health was named a clinical training site for anesthesia providers pursuing advanced education in managing acute surgical pain. It was one of only three locations in the country to be designated as a clinical training site for the Acute Surgical Pain Management Fellowship, a nationally accredited program for experienced Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists through the American Academy of Nurse Anesthetists. Other designated sites are in Idaho and Oklahoma. Horizon Health was chosen because of its unique and extensive experience with peripheral nerve blocks.

#### **RURAL HEALTH AWARDS**

Samantha McCarty, critical care manager, received the 2018 EMS Professional of the Year Award from the Illinois Rural Health Association. The award honored Samantha for her positive impact regarding the opioid epidemic in east central Illinois, the creation of Horizon Health's new ambulance service, and her work to improve patient satisfaction at the organization. She also initiated the process for Paris Community Hospital to become recognized as an Acute Stroke-Ready Hospital.

Philip Holloway, DPM, received a 2018 Rural Physician of Excellence Award from the Illinois Rural Health Association. The award is presented to doctors who have made a significant impact on the health of their communities and have shown dedication toward improving access to care in medically underserved areas of the state.

#### **TOP HOSPITAL**

Paris Community Hospital was recognized as a topperforming rural hospital in the nation for its excellence in patient satisfaction by the Chartis Center for Rural



Health and the National Organization of State Office of Rural Health. The Performance Leadership Award recognized Horizon Health staff for their commitment to providing quality care.






## **FINANCIAL OPERATIONS CENTER**


